Message from our Spiritual Director

Come, Holy Spirit! Pentecost brings to a close Eastertide and marks the birth of the Church. We are in the era of the Holy Spirit that Jesus has made over his Church. The gift of Pentecost - the outpouring of the Holy Spirit, and the spiritual gifts and blessings of God - are made possible through the death, resurrection, and ascension of the Lord Jesus. After his resurrection Jesus "breathed" on his disciples and gave them the Holy Spirit. Just as God breathed life into Adam. God "breathes" His Spirit into our souls that we may live in His life and love; God ignites the "fire" of His Spirit within our hearts and minds that we may seek God in all things in order to realize the coming of His reign. Holy Spirit is God living in us and transforming us so that we may bring His life and love to our broken world. So, the gift of the Holy Spirit is an impartation of "new life" for his people. With the gift of the Holy Spirit a new creation begins.

The Holy Spirit is sometimes called the forgotten person of the Blessed Trinity. In comparison to our Lord Jesus, who lived upon this earth as a man and whose works and preaching are so familiar to us, and even in comparison to the Father, to whom is attributed the work of creation, Catholics often neglect devotion to the Holy Spirit. Nevertheless, the works of sanctification are commonly attributed to him. The solemnity of Pentecost is a great reminder of all the works of the Holy Spirit.

Pentecost is an event of both the past and the present. St. Oscar Romero said, "Pentecost is not just one day, but every day. Without breath, there is no life. Without the Spirit, the Church is a field of dry, dead bones." The Holy Spirit did not descend upon the Church on this one occasion to desert it. He reigns with it still. For in the words of Christ, "I will send you another Advocate, to dwell with you forever." As the soul abides in the body of humans, so the Holy Spirit abides in the body of the Church. With the decent of the Holy Spirit at Pentecost the disciples were enlightened and empowered as they went forth to preach the gospel of our Lord. They were touched, torched and transformed by the fire of Holy Spirit. Their fear turned to fortitude, cowardice to courage, mess to message, test to testimony and vice to victory. All through their mission, the Holy Spirit consoled, comforted and counselled them.

The Lord Jesus offers each one of us the gift and power of his Holy Spirit. He wants to make our faith strong, give us hope that endures, and a love that never grows cold. He never refuses to give his Spirit to those who ask with expectant faith. Jesus instructed his disciples to ask confidently for the gift of the Spirit: "If you then, who are evil, know how to give good gifts to your children, how much more will the heavenly Father give the Holy Spirit to those who ask him!" (Lk 11:13). Do we thirst for God and for the abundant life he offers through the gift of his Spirit?

The gift of the Holy Spirit moves its recipients to action and inspires them to share this gift with others. St. Paul insists that these spiritual gifts are to be used in the present time for the benefit of others, for the common good, and for the building up of the Body of Christ. Let us ask the Holy Spirit to rekindle in us the spirit of new life and enthusiasm, the fire of God's love.

Come Holy Spirit! Make our ears to hear. Make our eyes to see. Make our mouths to speak. Make our hearts to seek. Make our hands to reach out And touch the world with your love. AMEN. (St. John Henry Newman)

### 2023 Franciscan Vision Global Summit: April 29th Session via Zoom

Brothers from the Order of Friars Minor (OFM) of the Province of the Immaculate Conception of New York sang the opening hymn to the Holy Spirit from Rome. *Fr. Xavier Durairaj, OFM*, the Provincial of the Franciscan Province of St. Thomas the Apostle, India, gave the welcome address. - Peace is the essence of all religions. Saint Francis said peace is a gift of God. *May the Lord give you peace!* With this greeting Francis was invited to spread peace to everyone.

<u>Br Ignacio Ceja Jiminez, OFM</u> from Mexico presented **The Friars Minor as Peacebuilders Today: Echoing the Rule of 1223.** The basis for the presentation is <u>The Rule of 1223</u> within the context of a violent world of the time. Francis was involved in the wars between Assisi and Perugia in 1202; the war between the Papacy and imperial forces was being fought in Southern Italy in which he served in 1204. Francis experienced a conversion in 1206 at age 24. A 5<sup>th</sup> Crusade was launched in 1215 under which Francis visited the Sultan in 2019 as a gesture of peace.

The life of St Francis and his writings have foundation in the Holy Scriptures.

<u>Scripture</u>: Whatever house you go into, let your first words be, "Peace to this house"; and if a man of peace lives there, your peace will go and rest on him; if not, it will come back to you. (Lk 10:5)

<u>Rule of 1223:</u> Into whatsoever house they may enter let them first say: Peace be to this house! Rb 3,13.

<u>Testament:</u> It is also the Lord who revealed to him this salutation that we should say: "The Lord give you peace." Test 23 (Num 6:24-26)

<u>The Life:</u> Whensoever he preached, before setting forth God's word to the congregation he besought peace, saying, "The Lord give you peace". 1C 23.

Francis is a preacher of peace in that he preached the Gospel of Jesus Christ. St Bonaventure said the Portiuncula is where the Order of Minors began, where the Franciscan charism was born as Francis conceived and gave birth to *the spirit of Gospel truth*. <u>LM 3,1</u>. The Franciscan charism, the life and mission of the brothers, is the proclamation of peace.

In Chapter 3 of <u>The Rule of 1223</u> Francis describes how the brothers are to go through the world.

I indeed counsel, warn, and exhort my brothers in the Lord Jesus Christ that when they go through the world, they be not litigious nor contend in words, nor judge others; but that they be **gentle**, **peaceful**, **and modest**, **meek and humble**, **speaking courteously** to all as is fitting...Into whatsoever house they may enter let them first say: Peace be to this house!

The five adjectives plus the adverb, courteously, refer to the ability to come out of oneself to enter into peaceful relationships with others, to move from possessing peace to announcing it. The theme of peace is ever present in the mind of Francis. He refers to the brothers as *guests and pilgrims*, having a pilgrim character while moving towards the goal of the future Homeland with God the Father. Most importantly Francis clarifies that peace is a gift in <u>The Blessing to Brother Leo</u>. ...*May He turn His countenance to you and give you peace...* The promotion

of peace is essential to a Franciscan life-mission. The peace that Franciscans are called to announce is the good news of the Kingdom of God and not merely limited to social peace. Only those who become children of peace, who have received from God the gift of peace, can generate peace. *Each one has the enemy in his power*. Admonition 10,2. It is necessary to know ourselves, to be attentive to our feelings and inner wounds so not to lose control and through inner healing move towards peace and tolerance. Franciscans must be deeply rooted in God, but at the same time immersed in the life of the world with all its joys and sorrows. Saint Francis says in Admonition 15, *Those people are truly peacemakers who, regardless of what they suffer in this world, preserve peace of spirit and body out of love of our Lord Jesus Christ*. Francis ascertained that peace can only be found in God and that its fruits must mature in the heart of a person before they can be shared with others. Going through the world *as brothers and minors*, without claiming to be masters of anything, abandoning all attitudes of superiority, makes witnesses of the goodness of God, the only true master, and allows them to affirm the dissolution of greed and domination which are often causes of human conflicts.

As you announce peace with your mouth, make sure that greater peace is in your hearts. Let no one be provoked to anger or scandal through you, but may everyone be drawn to peace, kindness, and harmony through your gentleness. <u>L3C 58</u>
