I would encourage members of different fraternities to interact with each other; some ideas are:

- Invite the nearby fraternities to celebrate with you, if your fraternity is celebrating the transitus of St. Francis.
- Invite members from other fraternities to work together in an apostolate serving the poor.
- Organize joint-initial formation sessions with nearby fraternities.
- Plan outreach initiatives together since many fraternities do not have ministry to youth and/or young adults.

All it takes is just a simple email to the nearby fraternity minister(s) with a sentence starting with "We would like to invite your fraternity members to..." The investment of simple email invitations can bear fruits of unity and fraternal spirit, foster/inspire leadership within your fraternity, and rejuvenate your fraternity. When we do this, we allow the Holy

Spirit to work within us and through us to touch others. I applaud those who have worked together with members beyond their own fraternities.

Whose glory do we seek? There can be no share in God's glory without the Cross. When Jesus prophesied about his betrayal and crucifixion, it did not make any sense to his disciples because it simply did not fit in their understanding of what the Messiah came to do. Do we resemble the disciples at times? We reject what we do not wish to see. Perhaps Jesus and the disciples were in two different wave-lengths. He was speaking about servanthood, suffering, betrayal, rejection and death. They were completely pre-occupied with who would be the greatest among them, and looking for the best position in his kingdom. When Jesus spoke about his painful death, he was repetitive and very clear about it. Whereas the disciples understood it as much as to shun it. They knew that the topic was ominous and painful; they deliberately failed to remove the veil, which covered the dreadful mystery. It is a natural, but disastrous, human impulse not to know the worst. When we confront a problem or a crisis in life, we must not run away from thinking and evaluating it objectively. Evasion is never a solution to a problem. We must learn to have courage to analyze any problem from every angle and be willing to face it. Jesus tells his disciples to embrace the attitude of a little child. In the ancient world, little children had no rights, position or privileges of their own. They were

socially at the bottom and at the service of their parents, much like the household staff or servants. The disciples must be humble and lowly of heartwho instead of asserting their rights, willingly empty themselves of pride and self-seeking glory by taking the lowly position of a servant or a child. Jesus washed the feet of his disciples, the greatest example for his followers to follow with all the heart, soul, mind and strength. True greatness and glory are in our humility and selfless service to our brothers and sisters.

Weekly Zoom Bible Study

In the first week of September, Our Lady of the Angels Regional Fraternity embarked on the video faith series The Wild Goose by Fr. Dave Pivonka (TOR). Episode 3 of this remarkable series deals with Baptism of the Holy Spirit and Fire. Father Pivonka in his down to earth, engaging manner explores this awakening of the graces we received at Baptism and Confirmation which often lie dormant within us. Father speaks of the many reported changes that one experiences after this "second coming" of the Spirit upon us. Among them, a keen sense of mission; of wanting to share with others, may be just what we need for rejuvenation of our Fraternities. He draws our attention to a quote from Pope Benedict XVI at St Peter's Square on the Solemnity of Pentecost, May 11, 2008:

Social Corner


