Dear Brothers and Sisters,



It shone with the beauty of a pure conscience, clad in the glory of his outstanding merits; the abundance of grace he had received and the Christ-like virtues he had practiced bore it aloft so surely that nothing could delay its entry into the vision of eternal light and glory.

St John of Capistrano Feast Day Oct 23

St John of Capistrano was born at Capistrano, Italy in 1385, the son of a former German knight in that city. He studied law at the University of Perugia and practiced as a lawyer in the courts of Naples. King Ladislas of Naples appointed him governor of Perugia. During a war with a neighboring town he was betrayed and imprisoned. Upon his release he entered the Franciscan community at Perugia in 1416. He and St. James of the March were fellow students under St. Bernardine of Siena, who inspired him to institute the devotion to the Holy Name of Jesus and His Mother. John began his brilliant preaching apostolate with a deacon in 1420. After his ordination he traveled throughout Italy, Germany, Bohemia, Austria, Hungary, Poland, and Russia preaching penance and establishing numerous communities of Franciscan renewal. When Mohammed II was threatening Vienna and Rome, St. John, at the age of seventy, was commissioned by Pope Callistus III to preach and lead a crusade against the invading Turks. Marching at the head of seventy thousand Christians, he gained victory in the great battle of Belgrade against the Turks in 1456. Three months later he died at Illok, Hungary. His feast day is October 23. He is the patron of jurists.

Let us be rooted in the Gospel and passionately spread the Good News of Jesus in our world, wounded by war, injustice and division. The Gospel invites us to embrace our future, the one the Lord is giving us, not the one we desire, in the certainty that God's dreams are better than ours. His plans bring full life and peace, that peace which Francis proclaimed and which sometimes, by grace, we also experience in our lives. St. Francis of Assisi sends us forth as brothers and sisters to the whole world, to bear witness to Jesus in word and deed, so as to draw everyone to the love of God. **Brothers and Sisters, let us begin again.**

Saint Francis and the Canticle of the Creatures - The Gift of Creation

On Saturday, November 1st., 2025 the National Formation Commission are leading a One Hour Prayer Service to share the Eighth Hundred Anniversary of Saint Francis and his *Canticle of the Creatures* across Canada. This celebration starts at 10 AM in BC, 11 AM in Alberta and 12 Noon in Saskatchewan and Manitoba. The *Canticle of the Creatures* is a beautiful glimpse into the heart of Saint Francis. It is a poetic vision, rich in theology and one of the earliest poems written in the vernacular or "voice" of the people. When Francis writes the prayer, he wants the people to sing the verses - his radical theological version of creation.

At this time, near the end of his life Francis is seriously ill with an eye infection. He knows that sunlight will cause intense pain in his eyes yet he praises the inherent goodness of sunlight and all of creation. His interdependence with creation and its relationship with the Creator gives him such joy that it soothes the pain and suffering. He comes to recognize the intrinsic goodness of God's community of which we are already a part. Saint Francis believes that what he calls "heart sight" or a sixth sense as "the eyes of the spirit" - the sun, the moon and the stars, the wind, the earth and fire and water - are already within him. By this insight he begins to see the loveliness of the created world. This unity and interdependence lead Francis to call each element of the created world his "Brother and Sister." He now understands in a mystical way the truth of kinship and sees himself not as a steward, but as a family member of creation.

Saint Francis of Assisi and his *Canticle of the Creatures* is a celebration of the "chorus" of creation expressed by the whole cosmos, as it gives praise to God.

The box will usually arrive in your mail box within two to three days. Franciscan Journey text books and Little Red Rule Books are \$30 CAD for the two books. Two years ago, I placed a large order with Smokey Valley Printing, USA to receive the bulk discount. The shipping boxes from Canada Post start at about \$20 for the small box which will fit three books. There are bigger book boxes available for larger orders.
